We want to share a few details with you about your upcoming tour(s) in Aberdeen. We are delighted that you've chosen to join us, and we hope you enjoy your day with us. Please keep this information with you to remind you of the itineraries and schedules.

GENERAL

- ✓ Scotland at any time of year can have varied weather; please ensure you have appropriate clothing such as waterproof/resistant jackets, several light layers of clothing is best and sturdy footwear. The average temperature in March is 10 degrees Celsius or 50 degrees Fahrenheit.
- ✓ We have three guides who will be facilitating the tours to ensure you'll be able to ask all the questions you have and receive the personal attention you deserve. Our guides are:



- ✓ Timekeeping. All our tours have a tight schedule and especially with larger groups it is important we are mindful of this. Please be on time for your collection in the morning and when returning to the meeting points/bus. We will endeavour to keep on time as much as possible and failure to do so may result in missing the tour or incurring additional costs.
- ✓ Meeting points. We will be collecting from two locations in Aberdeen for the Sunday through Tuesday tours and various locations on the Wednesday. Please check each day for pick up location.

The primary locations are:

- Doubletree by Hilton, **Aberdeen Beach Boulevard**, AB24 5EF. (Please note there are two Doubletree hotels in Aberdeen!)
- Holiday Inn / Holiday Inn Express at the Aberdeen Exhibition & Conference Centre, AB23 8BL.



- ✓ Most places, taxis & busses will accept payment by card, however for some purchases it is worth having a small amount of cash. (GBP Sterling)
- ✓ To get to your pickup points, you can use taxi services, buses or walk. The hotels in which you are staying will be happy to call a taxi for you.
